YOUTH PROGRAMS

Summer Enrichment

The Summer Enrichment Program ran for 5 weeks and served approximately twenty students in grades K-6. In week one, students explored different career opportunities, from yoga instruction to veterinary skills and engineering. Throughout week two, students took to the outdoors, exploring and learning new things about wildlife, nature, and the native peoples of the Hudson Valley.

Week three focused on creative activities like knitting and papermaking. Students spent their time learning about food in week four including about plant-based foods and key lessons on well-balanced and healthy diets. They enjoyed making (and eating!) hummus, pickles, ice cream and smoothies.

During the final week, students embarked on a journey through time in order to learn what life was like during the Colonial Era. Exploring the technology, pop culture (music, toys, fashion), and home life of the day provided the perfect end to a remarkably successful and educational summer!



After School

The 2021 After School program opened with two classes in mid-October serving twenty-two students in grades K-1 and 2-4. Each class incorporated literacy, numeracy, independent study time, social and emotional learning along with recreational play and healthy snacks that followed NYSDOE's Child and Adult Care Food Program guidelines.

Kristin McClune from the Northeast/Millerton Library continued her weekly *Read-Aloud* series, selecting a variety of books and providing interesting accompanying activities. The students enjoyed almost an hour each day of outdoor play: kicking the soccer ball, playing tag, and climbing the playscape. Students also enjoyed pumpkin decorating in October and planting garlic bulbs and harvesting popping corn from the NECC garden in November. As Thanksgiving approached, students decorated holiday cards for the elderly recipients of NECC's Food Pantry. December saw students learning about Hanukkah and making elaborate 3-D snowflakes. As the weather grew colder, students bundled up and made snow angels, sipped hot chocolate during an outdoor *Read-Aloud*, and enjoyed several days of sledding!

Due to COVID concerns, After School's schedule was interrupted in 2021. The program closed before Christmas Break and opened a bit later than normal. Still, staff were able to provide a quality, entertaining, and safe program for the students and families of the Webutuck School District over the course of the season.

FAMILY PROGRAMS

NEDCorps PROGRAM

The NED Corps program provided case management and crisis intervention services to 107 households, impacting a total of 287 residents in 2021. NED Corps provided housing and utility assistance, benefits applications, employment assistance and health and behavioral health referrals.

TAX PROGRAM

NECC was once again an **AARP** tax site in 2021. 211 tax returns were completed for a total combined refund of more than **\$220,000**.



FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

Financial education was provided to fifteen individuals with one-on-one coaching provided by a personal finance instructor. Education around budgeting, saving, credit and homeownership greatly improves students' personal finances and helps to meet both short and long-term financial goals.

HELPING FAMILIES THROUGH SPECIAL EVENTS

SCHOOL SUPPLY DRIVE

NECC created an Amazon wish list based off of Webutuck supply lists. The wish list was then shared with the community and among funders who in turn donated supplies valued at more than **\$2,000**. The supplies were distributed to students' families and directly to Webutuck in time for the start of the 2021 school year.

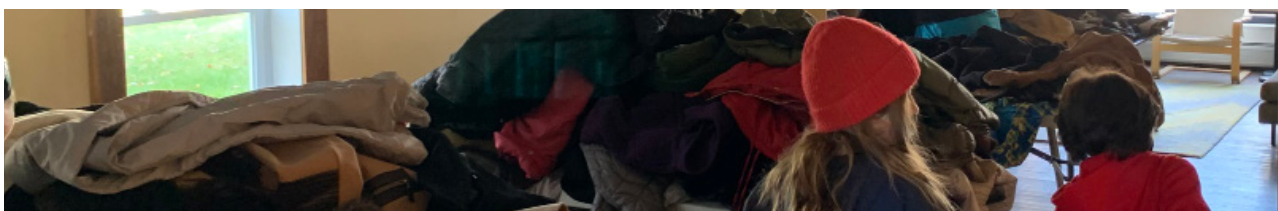


COAT GIVEAWAY

The NECC's annual Coat Giveaway provided 150 coats to residents in need. The event also provided hats, gloves, clothes, and shoes. Residents chose what they wanted from a wide selection and were then treated to hot cocoa and popcorn by **Teen Team** members.

HOLIDAY HELPING HANDS

In partnership with the **United Way of the Dutchess-Orange** region, NECC awarded forty households with a \$50 credit on their utility account. These vouchers assist households with the increased cost of utilities that come with the winter season.

TEEN PROGRAMS

NED Corps School-to-Work:

Thanks to a generous grant from the **Berkshire Taconic Community Foundation**, the School-to-Work program provides opportunities for students at Webutuck, Dover Plains, Pine Plains, and Millbrook Public Schools to explore career paths upon graduation from high school. By pairing students with local trades during their junior/senior year of high school, students will gain insight into the diversity of career fields while enhancing their life skills.



Teen Jobs Program:

The Community Partnership Program paid **\$59,829.63** in wages to twenty-seven teens during the year. Students from Webutuck School District worked with local businesses and farms, learned professional skills, and budgeted money for college and other future endeavors.

Teen Team:

The dedicated team of teen volunteers logged a total of **99 hours** of community service time, fostering connections and bringing cheer to many throughout the region. During quarantine, the Team came together virtually and made Valentine wreaths for seniors at **Noble Horizons** and tissue paper flowers to thank the staff of **Sharon Hospital**. The group spent **194** hours participating in educational workshops ranging from restorative circles to healthy relationship training. The workshops occurred virtually or socially distanced outdoors.



FOOD PROGRAMS

NECC and Webutuck School Community Gardens:

The 2021 season saw lots of activity in both the NECC community garden as well as the Webutuck school garden. This season focused mostly on growing smaller, more diverse plant types for youth education and slightly larger plantings of items commonly requested for the **NECC Food Pantry** and the **Summer Meal Program**.



Youth from the NECC **Afterschool Program** planted early season crops like peas and radishes and spent afternoons digging for worms, watering seedlings and harvesting fresh strawberries. Teen interns helped maintain the garden during the summer season and harvested produce for **NECC Food Access Programs**. The Afterschool Program revisited the garden in the fall to harvest popcorn and plant garlic for 2022.

Regional Food System Initiatives:

In 2021, staff at NECC food programs actively participated in several regional organizing efforts focused on increasing food security. NECC facilitated a regional **Dutchess County Food Pantry** networking group which met quarterly in 2021. Food Programs staff were also active members of the **Hudson Valley Food Systems Coalition** food access working group which held conversations, hosted guest speakers and worked on a community needs assessment in 2021. In November, NECC Food Programs co-hosted a community mapping event called **Food Sovereignty in the Hudson Valley**, collaborating with the **Stardust Fund** and the Hudson Valley Food Systems Coalition to bring local food system leaders together for networking, needs assessment and conversation.



Teen Farm and Food Education:

As part of Dutchess County's **Summer Youth Employment Program**, NECC employed seven Webutuck students as food program summer interns in July and August 2021. Interns participated in growing food at community gardens and local farms, prepared breakfasts and lunches from scratch for the **Summer Meals Program** and supported the NECC food pantry in distributing food to households in need. Skill building exercises emphasized growing fresh food, learning food preparation skills and distribution while focusing on the interconnected elements of our regional food system.

INCREASING FOOD ACCESS

Food and Supply Pantry:

In 2021, the NECC Food and Supply pantry provided groceries to **415** unduplicated adults, seniors, and children. Over the course of 2021, groceries for over **78,000** meals were distributed to residents of Millerton/North East, Amenia, Wassaic and Dover Plains. The NECC food pantry focused on culturally relevant staple foods as well as ensuring access to fresh, nutritious food. Food pantry participants received over **27,500 lbs.** of fresh produce in 2021 with over **15,000 lbs.** provided by local producers.



Summer Meals Program:

The Summer Meals program successfully adapted its approach for the second year in a row despite constraints created by the pandemic. NECC provided free nourishing breakfasts and lunches to Webutuck students throughout summer break 2021. In July and August, the program served **5,922** meals to **121** students via pick-up at school-based summer enrichment programs as well as via home delivery. The talented kitchen crew made sure fresh produce from neighboring farms and the Webutuck school garden was consistently incorporated into meals and snacks.

Fresh Food Pantry:

From June through November 2021 the Fresh Food Pantry program distributed **480** fresh vegetable boxes, over three hundred gallons of milk and three hundred dozen eggs to partner food pantries in Pine Plains, Amenia, and Dover Plains. The program collaborated with regional agricultural producers **Rock Steady Farm, Hudson Valley Fresh** and **Feather Ridge Farm** to ensure fresh, nutritious foods were available to low-income residents throughout the NECC service area.



COMMUNITY PROGRAMS



Affordable Housing-Tri-Town Coalition:

The Tri-Town Coalition (TTC) is a partnership of a variety of local stakeholders who coordinate their strengths and efforts toward raising the awareness of the ongoing need for affordable housing in northeast Dutchess County. The NECC serves as a founding member and facilitator for the coalition. NECC also facilitates the **TTC Steering Committee** and its monthly meetings. In addition, the NECC assists with and facilitates meetings of town based TTC work groups on a monthly basis. NECC

facilitated with the development and presentation of the **Housing Ambassador Training Program** in 2021. A three-part training session centered within the Tri-Town area. The program focused on clear messaging that highlighted the need for affordable housing in northeast Dutchess County. Over one hundred participants attended the two training sessions held in 2021.

NECC Community Engagement:

The NECC found safe, effective ways of engaging community members during the year. In the first quarter of 2021, the **NECC Community Program** staff scheduled over twenty people for COVID vaccination appointments and transported approximately forty people to those appointments.

NECC hosted an in-person **Community Clean-Up Day** event on April 24, 2021. Over thirty volunteers from Webutuck's middle and high schools along with NECC staff members, conducted rail trail and NECC grounds clean-up; garden bed prepping; powerwashing the NECC deck, and replacing stones in the NECC parking area.

The Hispanic Heritage Festival returned as an in-person event in 2021.

Over sixty attendees enjoyed live Latin music; flamenco dancing; fresh-made empanadas; free crafts for kids; and a treat-laden piñata. In addition, a COVID vaccination clinic set up by Sun River Health was provided to community members.



NECC Transportation Program:

The NECC Transportation Program serves residents of six towns at no charge and seeks to support underserved populations, particularly seniors. The program focuses on affording riders' access to medical appointments and grocery shopping options. Despite the continued restrictions on passenger capacities and crossover, the NECC Transportation Program increased year-over-year service by **42%** in 2021.

THE MILLERTON FARMERS MARKET

2021 Farmers Market

Despite some lingering pandemic challenges, the Millerton Farmers Market remained open safely without any interruption. COVID restrictions were lifted in the summer and more normal operations were restored. This meant the return of children's activities, contests, live music, cooking demonstrations, and special events such as **Dog Day**, **Bluegrass Day**, and **Halloween Happenings**. Events and live music were supported either directly or indirectly through community donations. Among our collaborators were the North East/Millerton Library, The Little Guild, The Hudson Valley Bluegrass Association, Daisy Hill Farm, Irving Farm, Ledgewood Kennel, Sand Road Animal Hospital, Millerton Veterinary Clinic, and Main Street Magazine. Local Community Organizations utilizing the Community Table market space included the North East/Millerton Library, Project Hope, Sunday in The Country Food Drive, Webutuck High School, Indian Rock Schoolhouse, NE Broadband Access and Grow Against Poverty. Finally, the Market gratefully acknowledged the participation of two teen interns from **NECC's Community Partnership with Schools and Business Program**.



Highlights for the season included:

- 250% Increase in SNAP/EBT purchases.
- Average Vendor rating of 7.8 out of 10 for the season.
- 4% Increase in daily average attendance compared to 2020.

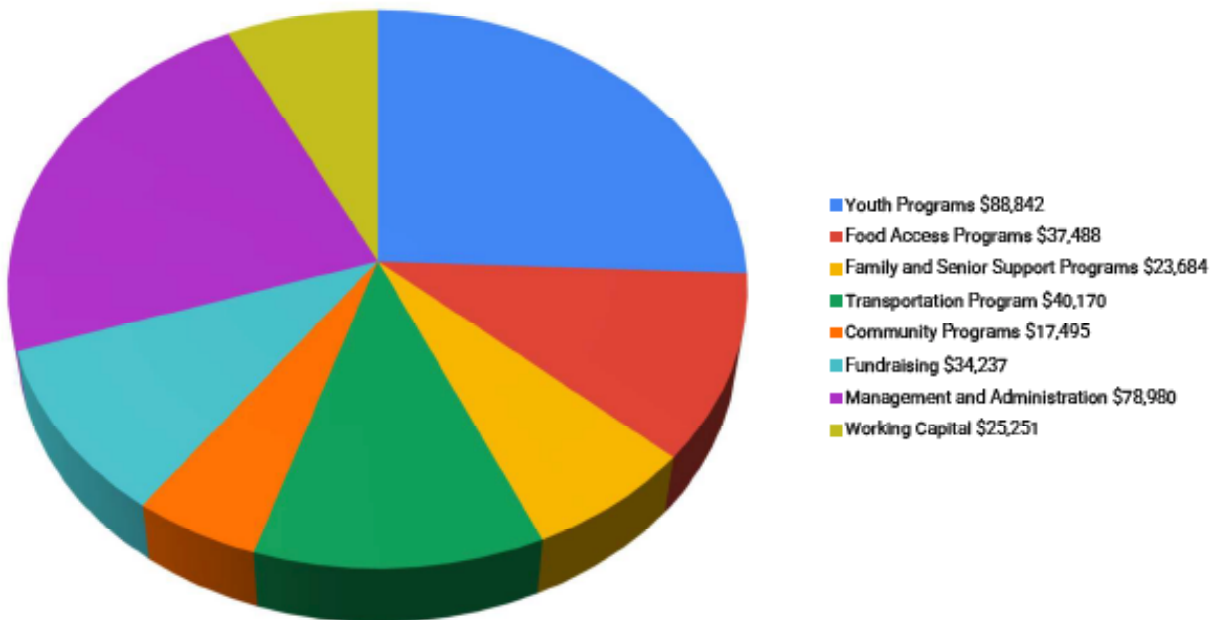

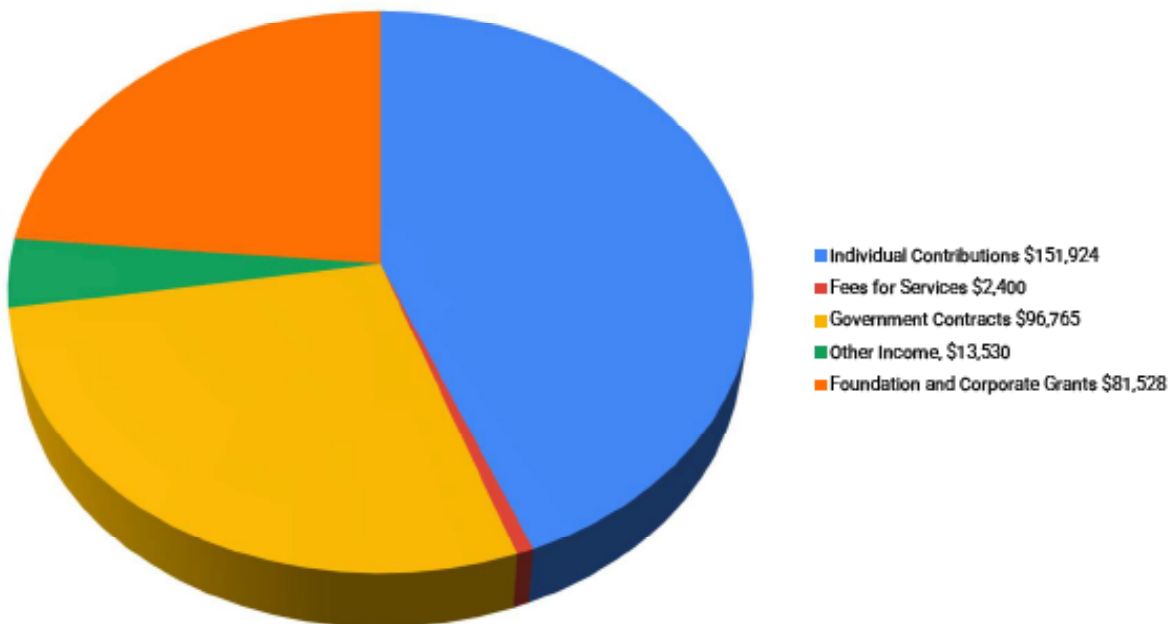

October to December 2020 Expenses

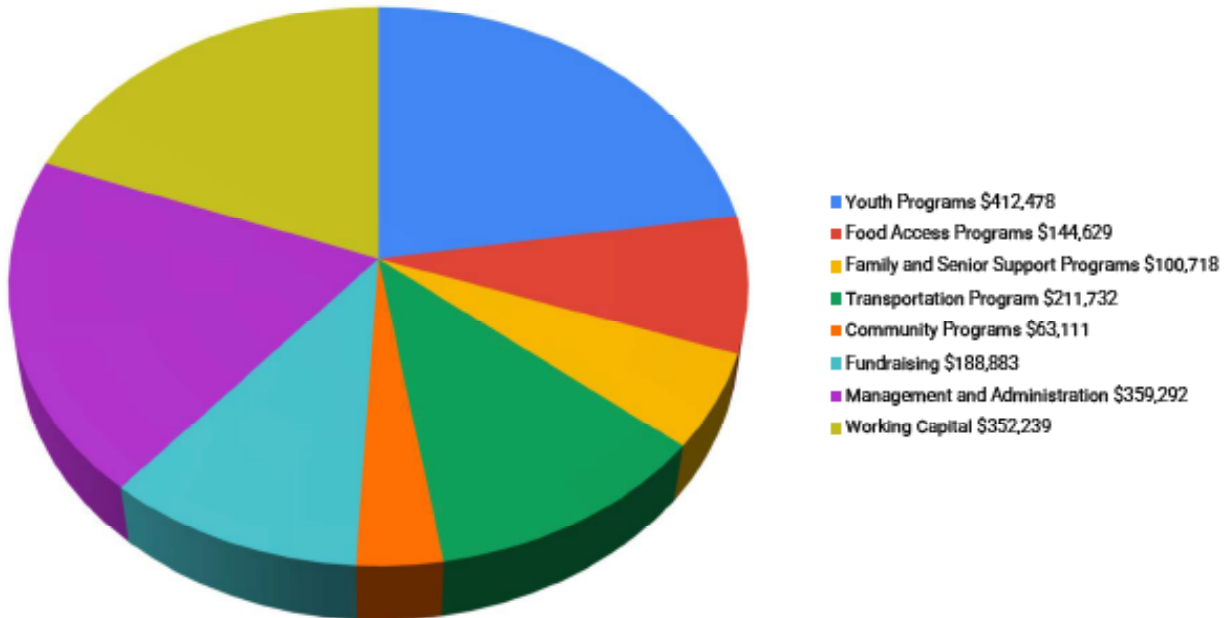


October to December 2020 Revenue

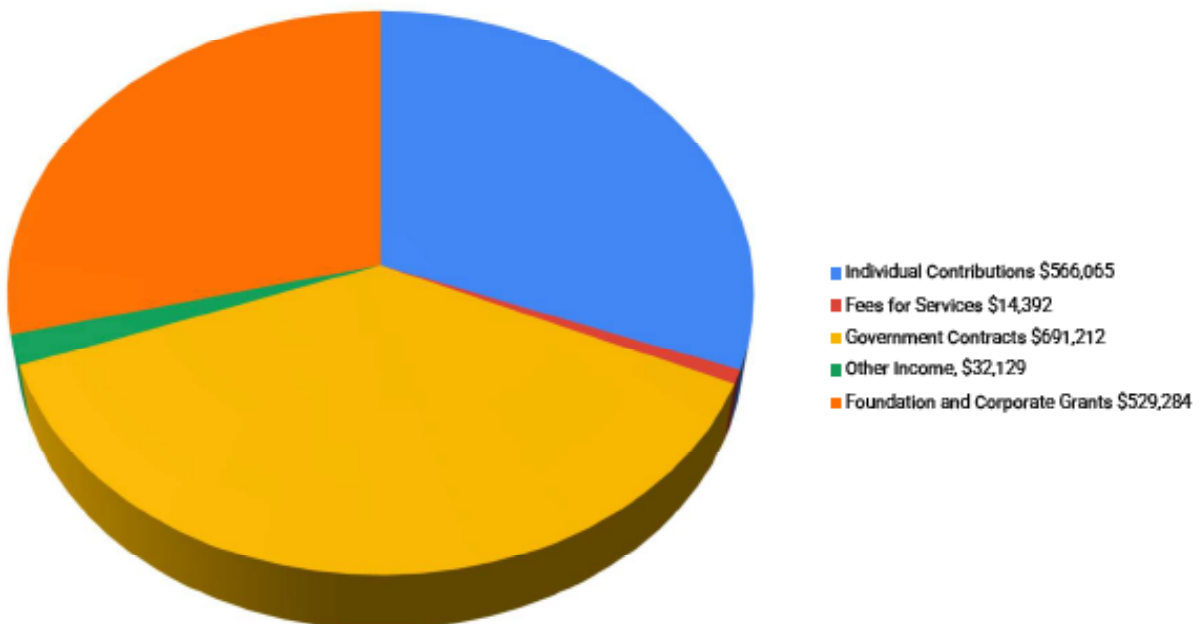
